- Our over all aim of youth work is to support the personal and social development of young people through non-formal and in-formal learning.
- In order to do this, our "idea of youth work" is that youth work should:

"Stimulate and support activities that are based on and requires the active engagement and responsibility of young people."
















An easy-to-use web-based system that

✓ Key figures




The Logbook enables us:

We compile statistics, results from the questionnaires and the key figures to an overall result




